

Cardboard Tube Kazoo

Do you love music? Have you ever wanted to make your own musical instrument? Using a few household materials, you can make your very own kazoo! Kazoos are membranophones, which produce sound by vibrating a stretched membrane. With this homemade instrument, the vibrations from your voice wiggle the wax paper of the kazoo, creating a buzzing sound!

Materials needed:

- A cardboard tube
- Wax paper
- Rubber bands
- Scissors
- Markers (Optional)



Step-by-step instructions:

- 1. Poke a hole in the side of the cardboard tube, about 2 inches from one of the ends.
- 2. Cut a square of wax paper that is 1 or 2 inches bigger than the diameter of the tube.
- 3. Wrap the wax paper around the end of the tube where you poked the hole and secure it tightly with a rubber band.
- 4. Trim the extra wax paper and decorate the tube with markers (optional).
- 5. Bring the open end of the tube to your mouth. Hum, sing, and talk into it!

Additional explorations:

- Try blowing into the kazoo instead of humming or singing. What changes?
- What would your kazoo sound like if you used a different material instead of wax paper?
- Would your kazoo sound different if you used a longer or shorter tube?

Discussion questions:

- What other instruments use material stretched over something to make a sound?
- Why do you need a hole punched in the kazoo for it to work?
