The Modified General Museum Visitor Satisfaction Index (M-GMVS) is a five-item self-report survey measure intended to assess museum visitors' general satisfaction with an exhibit experience. Respondents rate their level of agreement to each item using a seven-point Likert-like scale with five anchor categories (strongly disagree to strongly agree). Satisfaction scores are constructed using the unweighted average across all five items.

Development process

Items for the M-GMVS were adapted from Packer (2004) to be relevant to experiences at museum exhibits. For example, the item "the visit was as good as I had hoped" was modified to read "the experience was as good as I had hoped." The English version of the instrument was originally piloted with 61 visitors (Pattison, Randol, et al., 2016). These items were then translated into Spanish by a team of three qualified, bilingual/bicultural researchers. Validity and reliability were tested for the final English and Spanish versions with 263 adult visitors surveyed after engaging with interactive math exhibits with their families. The full M-GMVS development process is described in Pattison et al. (2016).

Cultural assumptions and considerations

- The M-GMVS allows visitors to assess satisfaction based on their own goals and criteria. However, it does not provide insights into the underlying causes of the satisfaction, including different cultural expectations related to the museum experience.
- The original version of the measure was developed in English and the English items were not modified during the translation process to consider issues of cross-cultural validity.
- The number of Spanish responses in the final study was not large enough to assess validity and reliability separately for the English and Spanish versions.
- There were no statistically significant correlations between the M-GMVS and participant gender, ethnicity, race, languages spoken at home, or education level. Scores may have differed based on respondent characteristics not measured in the study.

Reliability and validity evidence

- Internal consistency, or reliability among items, was high (Cronbach's $\alpha=0.95$).
- Principal component analysis (PCA) provided strong evidence that the five items related to a single underlying dimension. Component loadings ranged from 0.89 to 0.94 for the five items and the single factor solution explained 83% of the variance in responses.
- As evidence of convergent validity, the M-GMVS was strongly correlated with reported enjoyment of the mathematical elements of the experience ($r=0.47$, $p<0.001$).
